

Bio301D On-line Activity 7 (2013) ([links](#) at bottom of this page)

For the seventh 'quiz' activity in Bio301D, you should look at two articles about chocolate consumption and Nobel Prizes. You will be asked about the content in each and will need to compare the two articles. The New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM) article is the original; the BBC popularization is based on it.

- 1) Go over the articles before you start the quiz (and make sure you find the first pages of each article – sometimes the links take you into the middle).
- 2) You have 180 minutes to complete the quiz from the time you access the first question. I have been told that you can log out and log back in, but the timer starts and continues going from the time you start your first question. So once 180 minutes has expired from the time you start your first question, you will no longer be able to submit answers. To ensure that you don't run into problems with Quest, try to avoid 7:00 – 10:00 PM.
- 3) You are free to answer the questions while looking at the links. I have been told that you can move between questions without answering them, but once you answer a question and move on, you will not be allowed to change your answer.
- 4) You are expected to answer the questions on your own.
- 5) You won't know if you answered correctly until after the due date. You should not see a score before then.
- 6) The due date is **7:00 PM on Saturday, 9 November**.
